## **Article I: General Rules**

## Section I: General Expectations

- 1. Participants, moderators, and members of the audience shall be respectful of each other at all times.
- 2. All candidates and affiliated individuals shall be held accountable to the contents of these rules as well as the current Executive Board Election Rules.
- 3. All debate rules violations shall be addressed as established by the current Executive Board Election Rules.

## Section II: Participants

- Candidates for Student Body President, Executive Vice President, Vice President of Finance, and Vice President of Internal Affairs shall be the only participants in the debate.
- 2. Candidates shall refrain from using technology at all times during the debate.
- 3. Candidates may print copies of their platform for personal use, but are not allowed to use props of any kind during the debate.

## Section III: Moderators

- 1. The SEC Co-Chairs shall be the moderators of the debate and shall enforce all rules and regulations hereby established.
- 2. Moderators must not actively engage in discussion with candidates
- 3. Moderators must address any disrespectful behavior and redirect the debate when necessary
- 4. In order to ensure fairness and impartiality, moderators must enforce debate rules equally, especially those pertaining to speaking time limits.

## Section IV: Audience

1. The audience shall maintain appropriate decorum to avoid distractions to candidates, moderators and other members of the audience.

## **Article II: Debate Format**

#### Section I: Opening Statements

- 1. Each slate shall be given a total of three minutes to present an opening statement.
- 2. All candidates may speak during the opening statement for their slate.
- 3. The order in which slates will obtain the floor shall be determined randomly and shall be alternated for the duration of the debate.

## Section II: General Questions

- 1. The SEC shall prepare a set of general questions, applicable to all slates participating in the debate.
- 2. All questions asked by the SEC shall be neutral and, thus, not favor any slate or candidate.
- 3. After the SEC has asked a question, each slate shall have a maximum of 2 minutes to respond to that question.
- 4. After each slate has been given time to answer the question, there shall be a period of 5 minutes of open discussion, which must relate to the question or topic at hand.
- 5. The SEC reserves the right to modify speaking times depending on overall time constraints.

## Section III: Platform-Specific Questions

- 1. The SEC shall prepare a set of questions relating to each slate's platforms.
- 2. All questions asked by the SEC shall be neutral and, thus, not favor any slate or candidate.
- 3. For each round of questions the SEC must:
  - a. Ask one question that is applicable to all slates **OR**,
  - b. Ask one question of equal complexity to each slate.

- 4. After the SEC has asked a question, each slate shall have a maximum of 2 minutes to respond to that question.
- 5. After each slate has been given time to answer the question, there shall be a period of 5 minutes of open discussion, which must relate to the question or topic at hand.
- 6. The SEC reserves the right to modify speaking times depending on overall time constraints.

## Section IV: Questions from the Audience

- 1. Once the SEC has asked their set of questions, they shall allow the audience to ask questions to the candidates.
- 2. The SEC shall decide which members of the audience may ask a question at a given time
- 3. The SEC shall provide equal opportunity among the audience, giving preference to those who have not asked a question.
- 4. For each round of questions, members of the audience must:
  - a. Ask one question that is applicable to all slates **OR**,
  - b. Ask one question of equal complexity to each slate.
- After a member of the audience has asked a question, each slate shall have a maximum of 2 minutes to respond to that question.
- 6. No discussion period shall be provided after each slate has responded to the question.

## Section V: Closing Statements

- 1. Each slate shall be given a total of three minutes to present a closing statement.
- 2. All candidates may speak during the closing statement for their slate.
- 3. The order in which slates will be given the floor for closing statements shall be the same order in which opening statements were given.
