EDITORS' FOREWORD

Professor Joseph Brodley, after a long and distinguished career as an antitrust scholar, retired at the end of 2009. Boston University School of Law hosted a conference on September 18, 2009 honoring Professor Brodley. Leading antitrust scholars contributed to the conference, including professors of law, economics, and business; current and former FTC Commissioners; and antitrust advocates and practitioners. This Foreword describes the presentations given at the conference. The papers resulting from the presentations are published on the pages that follow.

Panel I: Professor Brodley's General Contributions to Antitrust Scholarship

The opening panel discussed Professor Brodley's contributions to the field of antitrust and his continuing influence in Supreme Court opinions, citations in legal scholarship, and the careers of scholars he mentored. Keith Hylton, Eleanor Fox, Richard Brunell, and Hillary Greene contributed to this panel.

Panel II: Topics in Antitrust to Which Professor Brodley Contributed

This panel discussed topics common to Professor Brodley's scholarship: predatory pricing, joint ventures, mergers, oligopoly, and the goals of antitrust law. Dennis Yao, Richard Dagen, and Michael Salinger presented their views.

Panel III: Antitrust and the Obama Administration

Professor Brodley suggested the topic for the final panel, which focused on the future of antitrust law in the Obama Administration. Einer Elhauge and William Kovacic were panelists, with Herbert Hovencamp providing a paper.
