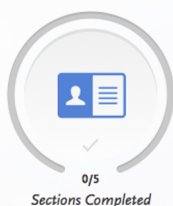

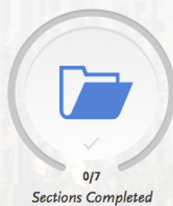

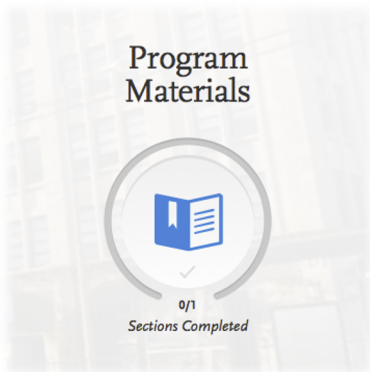

2. A scholarly paper of approximately 1,000-1,500 words in which you discuss a research article that has influenced your thinking about music teaching and learning. Cite other scholarly literature to make arguments regarding the potential impact of this research upon the music education profession.
