COM Minors for Non-COM Undergraduate Major

The College of Communication (COM) welcomes undergraduate students from across Boston University (BU) to explore our minor offerings. COM offers five different minors: Advertising, Public Relations, Media Science, Journalism, and Film and Television.

BU students must complete a course pre-requisite **BEFORE** they are eligible to formally declare a COM minor:

Advertising minor pre-requisite - COM CO 201 completed with a grade of a "C" or better.

Public Relations minor pre-requisite - COM CO 201 completed with a grade of a "C" or better.

Media Science minor pre-requisite - COM CO 201 completed with a grade of a "C" or better.

Journalism minor pre-requisite - COM CO 201 completed with a grade of a "C" or better.

Film and Television minor pre-requisite - COM FT 201 completed with a grade of a "C" or better.

COM minors CANNOT be formally declared until the pre-requisite course is completed and the minimum grade obtained. If COM becomes aware a student has a COM minor declared without the pre-requisite, we will contact your home school and ask them to drop the minor from your record.

Students are responsible for following all course and grade requirements to complete a COM minor. The College of Communication does not allow any course substitutions for our minors. Students must follow all course pre-requisites.

Students cannot declare more than one of the following COM minors: Advertising, Public Relations, or Media Science. For example, a student cannot minor in Advertising and minor in Public Relations.
