We welcome to this service all students and their families. May God's richest blessings be with all who graduate as they enter this new time in their lives. Today, we welcome as our speaker the **Reverend Dr. Robert Allan Hill**.

The Reverend Dr. Robert Allan Hill is the Dean of Marsh Chapel and a Professor of New Testament and Pastoral Theology at Boston University. As Dean of Marsh Chapel, he preaches most Sundays, leads the Marsh Chapel staff, gives oversight to all University religious life (including 7 University chaplains, 26 religious life groups, and 22 campus ministers), meets with University leadership, and guides pastoral care for the community.

At Boston University School of Theology, Dr. Hill teaches courses in New Testament and Pastoral Theology. He participates in teaching courses for BU undergraduates on vocation and the history of Boston University. Dr. Hill is the author of 17 books and has also written or co-authored and published a number of articles, chapters, sermons, and essays. His passionate interest lies at the intersection of Scripture and life, especially in the work of preaching. His perspective on pastoral theology focuses on the special needs of the church in the Northeastern USA in the 21st Century.

Dr. Hill is a graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University (BA 1976), Union Theological Seminary (MDiv 1979), and McGill University (PhD 1991). He has been preaching since 1976, and he has taught in several schools including McGill University, Syracuse University, Lemoyne College, Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School, Northeastern Seminary, United Seminary, and various church settings, before coming to Marsh Chapel in 2006. As an elder (Upper New York Conference) in the United Methodist Church, he has had experience in ten local churches, five different annual conferences, multiple annual conference board assignments, and general and jurisdictional conference participation and board reviews. His main denominational interests have been in large church ministry and theological education. Dr. Hill and his wife Jan have three grown children and eight grandchildren.

Dean Hill and Chapel leadership are now preparing with excitement for the 75th anniversary of the dedication of Marsh Chapel, to be held in 2025. Over these decades, the full measure of this pulpit reveals a constant, clarion voice of prophetic wisdom. Here, Howard Thurman preached of a "common ground and common hope," while training a younger protégé, Martin Luther King, Jr. Dean Hill has continued this preaching tradition of a responsible Christian liberalism, Sunday by Sunday, echoing Charles Wesley's hymn, "unite the pair so long disjoined, knowledge and vital piety, learning and holiness combine, truth and love for all to see."
