

# **Career Fair Intros in 4 Easy Steps**

## RETHINK THE CLASSIC "ELEVATOR PITCH"

- Too much information loses your audience and is too much to memorize. You can add more detail later in the conversation.
- You don't have to deliver the introduction as one part. You can open with just your name and greeting, let them respond, and then continue.
- Speak naturally, don't recite a script.

## 1. INTRODUCE YOURSELF AND GREET THEM

• Give your full name, smile, offer a handshake (if meeting in person), and a greeting. "Hi, I'm Jashanna Morton, it's so nice to meet you!"

#### 2. SUMMARIZE WHAT YOU DO

• Tell them briefly what you're studying and an interest or (if you have any) your current work. Keep it concise.

#### 3. STATE WHAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR

What brought you to this employer? What opportunities are you looking for?

## 4. ASK A QUESTION OR PROPOSE AN ACTION

Direct the conversation where you want it to go by finishing with a question or proposal.

### **PUT IT ALL TOGETHER!**

Hi, I'm Leslie Winston, it's so nice to meet you! I'm a Biomedical major and I work in the Biomechanics Lab. I'm interested in learning more about the AI Intern position at your robotics lab in Centerville. What are the qualifications for this role?"
