Jenny Erpenbeck was born in 1967 in Berlin. Her grandfather, grandmother and father were all published writers in a variety of genres, while her mother was a translator. She first trained as a book binder, before working in the props and costume departments at the Staatsopere. She then studied drama in Berlin. She has worked on opera and musical productions in Berlin and Graz since 1991, and is now a freelance writer and producer living near Graz.

Susan Bernofsky, one of the preeminent translators of German-language literature, teaches literary translation in the MFA Writing Program of the Columbia University School of the Arts, and chairs the Translation Committee of the PEN American Center.
