

The following applies only to Minors who declared prior to Fall 2022.

The minor in History of Art & Architecture allows students to gain a foundational understanding of the subject. The program requires five courses in History of Art & Architecture – a combination of broad survey courses and classes in specific fields and periods.

The department offers two minor tracks, as outlined below. Each track requires: one gateway survey course; two courses within the specific track; and two electives, which may or may not be in the same area – a total of five courses. Minors are encouraged to explore course offerings in the department, broadly, and to consider studying abroad. All students work with an adviser to guide course selection.

Option 1 – Western Art:

A total of five history of art & architecture (AH) courses. At least one of the following must be taken: CAS AH 111, 112, or 210. The four remaining courses should include at least two Western art classes and at least two courses at the 300 level or higher.

Option 2 – Non-Western Art:

A total of five history of art & architecture (AH) courses. At least one of the following must be taken: CAS AH 215, 220, 222, or 225. The four remaining courses should include at least two non-Western art classes and at least two courses at the 300 level or higher.

Option 3 – Architectural History:

AH 201, plus four other AH courses, including at least two architectural history classes and at least two courses at the 300-level or higher.

Grades

Students must earn a minimum grade of C in all courses taken toward the minor concentration.
