Estimated Proof of Funds Guidance*

Dear Admitted Student,

Please note that the BU Law calculated cost of attendance is slightly different than what is required by the US government for visa purposes. We believe our cost of attendance is accurate for our students based on our own experience, but students must demonstrate proof of funds as required by the US government to obtain an I-20.

As an example, Johannes is planning to attend the Pre-LLM 6 Week CELOP before his LLM program. He is coming to the US with his wife, Helena. So, the estimated cost of attendance for Johannes is \$116,754. Johannes also received a scholarship of \$5,000. This means Johannes will need to demonstrate funds available equal to \$112,287 in US dollars to obtain an I-20.
