

## MCH Fellowship & Diversity Scholars Week-long Virtual Fair October 3 – 7, 2022

**Practice Fellowships** are an opportunity for MPH students to work with a field supervisor onsite in a public health practice setting to gain hands-on experience and professional development. Projects include elements of maternal and child health (MCH) related programming, planning, evaluation, and/or quality improvement. Practice fellowships may be used as a practicum.

**Research Fellowships** are an opportunity for MPH students to work closely with a faculty member and their team to gain hands-on experience. Projects typically include elements of maternal and child health related research, education, or practice.

The **Diversity Scholars Leadership Program (DSLP)** supports emerging health professionals who seek to be leaders in the movement to eliminate health and other inequities and the achievement of social justice. The DSLP has two arms: (1) DSLP-URM for MPH students from under-represented minority communities and (2) DSLP-LGBTQIA+ for MPH students from LGBTQIA+ communities.

<ul> <li>Eligibility:</li> <li>Any MPH student who is committed to take one of several MCH courses, ideally in the first spring or summer semester of the fellowship: MC725, GH881, MC840, MC775, MC759, or EP759.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>MCH certificate MPH student</li> <li>A member of an under-represented minority group: American Indian or Alaska Native, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, South Asian, Southeast Asian, Latinx.</li> <li>DSLP-LGBTQIA+ Eligibility:         <ul> <li>SSG OR MCH certificate MPH students</li> <li>LGBTQIA identifying students from <u>ALL</u> racial and ethnic identities are eligible to apply.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
