ELIGIBILITY

- Students must have completed four semesters and have Junior standing
- Students must have taken at least four PO classes, including a PO 505+ seminar
- Overall GPA: 3.0 or above
- Major GPA: 3.5 or above
- Transfer students may apply the Spring semester of their Junior year
- Seniors are not eligible to apply
- This program is not open to students outside of CAS or students in the Dual Degree (DDP)

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The joint BA/MA Political Science degree gives students an opportunity to accelerate their studies and graduate with their bachelor's and master's degrees in four years. Students in the program will complete their graduate coursework throughout their fourth year in the College, write a thesis, and present their own research at the culmination of the program.

CURRICULUM

The MA is made up of eight discreet courses. Students must earn a grade of B- or above to receive credit. *Courses may not count for both the BA and the MA.*

Students will also enroll in **four additional courses** above a PO505 level to complete the program

Thesis Requirements:

- The thesis must be distinct from the graduate coursework
- Students may not resubmit work done during undergraduate or graduate coursework as their thesis, but they may build off of topics explore in previous courses
- Students will work closely with their Faculty Advisor. They will provide revisions on at least *two* drafts of the thesis paper and grade the final version.
- Students will present their research at the end of the year.
