In this module, the learner reflects on the different types of relationships they have with people in their lives and how they can be supported through active listening. Active listening techniques are also introduced as a way to support those they know who may be experiencing sexual harassment, bullying, or other negative experiences. Through interactive scenarios, the learner is able to apply

these skills and practice intervention techniques. They are also informed on several relevant pieces of legislation. including Title IX, that provides protections to them and their peers, in addition to NCAA guidelines.

In this module, sexual violence is defined and differentiated from sexual harassment. The learner is presented with the idea of consent, and explores the multi-faceted impact of trauma on targets of sexual harassment and violence. With this context, they are then presented with strategies to support survivors and targets, and apply these strategies in interactive scenarios. They also explore the concepts of intimate partner violence and stalking, and how to appropriately and safely intervene. Lastly, they are presented with several options for reporting these incidents -- both on campus, and in their local community.
